Mizoram University is one of the Premier Higher Educational Institutions not only in the North Eastern region but also in the country. A Central University, established in the year 2001 by an act of the parliament, Mizoram University is facilitating students with an exciting and student friendly learning environment since its inception. The University provides experiential and professional training to learners for all round development, thus helping students to find greater opportunities in their academic and professional endeavors. Mizoram University is moving ahead with a great vigor and confidence year after year, with remarkable development in academics, administrative and infrastructural expansions. The University is consecutively placed within 100 Higher Educational Institutions in the NIRF Ranking by the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India since the inception of NIRF rankings. Mizoram University is ranked 76th under the 'University' category for the Year 2023 (NIRF rankings). Moreover, the University is placed in the band 601-800 in the THE (Times Higher Educational) Impact Rankings 2022 and 1st in the North Eastern Region. Recently, as per the Indian Institutional Ranking Framework (IIRF) University Ranking 2023, six north-eastern universities made it to the top 20 Central Universities (overall) list, in which Mizoram University bagged the 13th rank leading ahead of other North Eastern Central Universities. It has been accredited with 'A Grade' by NAAC in the years 2014 and 2019 and an ISO Certification in July, 2018. There are 40 academic departments under the umbrella of 10 schools of studies, 5 Research Centers along with UGC-Women Study Center, UGC-Human Resource Development Center, MZU DST-Incubation Center, DST-BioNEST Incubator and DRDO-Industry-Academia-Centre of Excellence (DIA-COE). It has 1 constituent college and 40 affiliated colleges.

The total enrolment at present includes 1194 research scholars, 1868 post graduate students and 708 under graduate students. The constituent college, Pachhunga University College (PUC) has an enrolment of 2836 (1372 males and 1464 females) post graduate and under graduate students. 925 research projects and field projects were undertaken during the year 2021-2022. During the same period, 891 publications were made in international journals, national journals and as chapters in books. Several faculties have actively participated in various national and international conferences while many other faculties have excelled in their field of research and received honors and awards for their commitment and dedication to the academics.

Mizoram University is progressing towards academic excellence with various academic, research and extension activities in North East India. We are proud and honored to have successfully hosted the G20 summit here at the university. The theme, 'One Earth. One Family. One Future' will forever be enshrined in our academic perspectives even as we strive towards the themes of stability and sustainable growth in our endeavors. Greater Deeds Remain.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Mizoram University was created by an Act of Parliament (No. 8 of 2000) and it became functional from 2nd July, 2001. The University is located at Aizawl, the capital city of Mizoram and is spread over 978.1988 acres in an area on the outskirts of the city. Prior to the existence of Mizoram University, the North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) with headquarters at Shillong was operating a campus in Mizoram. Headed by a Pro-Vice Chancellor, the then Mizoram Campus of NEHU consisted of seven Post-Graduate Departments, namely, Economics, Education, English, Forestry, Mizo, Psychology and Public Administration. During the last 22 years of its existence, Mizoram University has made considerable progress in terms of infrastructure, academic programmes, manpower and support services.

Mizoram University was accredited 'A' grade by NAAC in 2014 and 2019. It was also awarded ISO Certification in 2018. The University was ranked as one of the top 100 Universities in India, assessed by the NIRF rankings from 2016 to 2023 under MHRD. In the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2022, Mizoram University secured 1st Rank in North-East Region of India. Mizoram University ranked 1st among the central universities of the North East region by bagging the 13th position in the Indian Institutional Ranking Framework (IIRF) 2023's Top 20 Central Universities category. The University has 39 functioning academic departments offering UG, PG and Ph.D. programmes under 10 Schools of Study. The University has 40 affiliated colleges and one constituent college. The University is one of the pioneering Universities in the country which has successfully implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) since 2013. In line with the NEP 2020 Mizoram University is progressing towards offering programmes that envisage broad based, multi-disciplinary and holistic education at various levels of UG and PG Programmes.

The University was awarded Grade 'A' by the Mizoram State Pollution Control Board which conducted a Green Audit of the University Campus during the months of March-April 2013. It is an eco-friendly University and is one of the first Universities in the country to run effectively on Solar Power System. The Academic Buildings, Hostels, Administrative Blocks and the streetlights within the Campus are all supported by the Solar photo voltaic power plant for electricity.

The University provides facilities for Disabled and Visually Challenged students and staff. All buildings in the University Campus have ramps for wheelchairs; disabled-friendly washrooms are also available in the hostels.

Faculty and students play an active role in extension activities like the Red Ribbon Club, Techno Club, NSS and SPIC MACAY- Heritage Club. Several members of the faculty and students are also actively involved in social services, some of which are curriculum stipulated.

The University from its inception encourages its students to take part in Sports and Cultural Activities. The University has a Sports department with different coaches. Every year the students participate in the East Zone Inter University Sports and in the All India Inter University Sports.

Mizoram University is about an hour's drive from the heart of the main city of Aizawl, the capital of the State of Mizoram. The University provides transportation at a highly subsidized rate. The City is connected by Air from Kolkata, Guwahati & Imphal. It is also well connected by road from Silchar, Guwahati, Shillong etc. The nearest Railhead is Silchar. Mizoram has a pleasant climate and is generally cool in summer and not very cold in winter. The temperature varies from 11°C to 21°C in winter and between 20°C and 29°C in summer. Mizoram has great natural beauty and is also very rich in flora and fauna.



- Kendriya Vidyalaya was established within the University premises in 2010.
- The University has implemented the required academic, examination and administrative reforms mandated by UGC in 2009. All PG and UG Programmes inside the campus are in CBCS mode.
- Automation of Examination and Finance Sections, as well as intra Campus network and Internet facilities contribute to enhanced efficiency of the University work and study culture.
- The University has achieved several measures to establishing an eco-friendly campus with 700KWp Solar voltaic power plant for electricity generation, solar Street light and Solar Water Heaters in the Campus.
- “Online Students Feedback System” for Administrative & Academic Quality Assurance monitored by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is regularly implemented.
- Two (2) Helipads have been built.
- Amphitheatre for entertainment and performances is accessible to all.
- Mizoram University is differently-abled friendly with the following facilities:
 - i) Concession and exemption of fees for blind students as per provisions of MZU Ordinance OF-1
 - ii) Escort/Attendance Allowance @ Rs. 2000/- per month.
 - iii) Reader Allowance @ Rs. 2000/- per month.
 - iv) Digital Voice Recorders to enable them to comprehend Class Room Lecturers.
 - v) One Basic Braille Embosser, Duxbury Braille Translator, 2 (two) Computer sets equipped with Readit Wand Scanner, Supernova Screen Reader and magnifier facilities has been installed at the Central Library of the University with the help from M/s Sparsh Products, Dehradun in 2011.
 - vi) 5% of seats on admission to Post Graduate Departments is reserved for persons with disabilities.
- The mizoram University Auditorium located in the hearts of the University Campus has excellent acoustics, Stage Lighting System, Fire Fighting System, Central AC and an Exhibition Hall. The Auditorium is accessible to patrons with disabilities; ramps and spaces for wheelchairs are present.
- 173 Classrooms covering all the disciplines of the University, with ICT and LCD facilities in 152 classrooms and 20 Seminar Halls across the Campus. The entire campus is also Wi-Fi enabled.
- E-journals access is provided through campus LAN. The remote access of E-journal is also possible. 25 Departmental Libraries exist in addition to the Central Library.
- There are 20 Computer Laboratories across the departments. The University has around 98 laboratories with high end instruments for research and academic activities.
- The University has a Metrological Station, Soil Erosion Detection Centre, Water measuring Instrument and a Permanent Geodetic GPS Station has been installed to monitor ground motion in the region.
- Horticulture farm of 1.5 hectare, Mist/growth chamber, Forestry garden/experimental plot of 2-hectare, Plant Herbarium Chamber / Compact Storage System, Botanical garden of 7 hectare, Bamboo Setum, Arboratum Horticulture garden, Nursery house, Orchid house, Animal House of 2000 sqm.
- State Biotech Hub, DST-Bioinformatics Centre, DST-Incubation Centre, Tribal Museum and Archive, Material Gallery, Design cell, Studio for Architecture, MOOCs Studio, Central Instrumentation facility are available.
- Engineering Workshop for B.Tech. students with fitting and welding machinery, 3D printer, CNC, Router, 3DScanner, CNC Laser engraver, electric welding, Gas welding facility in DST Incubation Centre.

Today, Mizoram University looks ahead to the future with enthusiasm under the able leadership of our Vice Chancellor, in order to continue to be a blessing for its stakeholders, the region and the nation, while constantly striving to achieve greater goals in keeping with its motto, ‘Greater Deeds Remain’.

THE FACULTY

There are 22 Senior Professors (HAG), 62 Professors, 35 Associate Professors and 141 Assistant Professors currently working in Mizoram University, out of a total of 260 faculty as on 31st March, 2023.

The Academic departments continue to make consistent progress in teaching and research activities. As per the latest Annual Report of the University (2021-2022), There are 150 ongoing research projects, out of which 108 are major and 42 are minor projects amounting a total sum of Rs. 5970.59 lakhs under the extra mural fundings' obtained from various funding agencies. About 974 publications were published in international journals, national journals and book chapters. A total of 108 books were published by both national and international publishers during the period under report and 446 faculty members attended various Faculty Development/Induction Programs. Several teachers have excelled in their field of research and received honors and awards for their commitment and dedication to the academics.

Several members of the faculty are also actively involved in social and extension services and consultancy programmes under various forums that link the university and the society of the region. Some of these activities include Blood Donation Camps, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Plantation, Cleanliness Drive, Awareness Campaigns, Creation and Renovation of public assets through Red Ribbon Club, NSS, Adolescence Education and others.

The Faculty plays an active role in the University governance through their participation in various decision-making bodies at various levels and capacities such as the Executive Council, Academic Council, Mizoram University Court, School Board, Board of Studies, non-statutory committees, etc.

The project title was "Feasibility of HIV Self-Test Among Youth in Mizoram: A Demonstration Project". The Project was implemented in 2022-2023.

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HALL OF RESIDENCES

Mizoram University provides halls of residences or hostels to the students of the university. Presently, the University maintains twelve hostels on campus - 7 for boys and 5 for girls. The intake capacity of each hostel except two research scholars' hostels is over 100 students. Hostellers are provided basic amenities and free internet connectivity through Wi-Fi system. There is a provision for round the clock water and electricity facilities for the hostels.

A student seeking admission into a hostel has to apply through **Online Form accessible at the University Website**. Selection of Hostellers is done by the Office of Dean of Students' Welfare (DSW) on the basis of Merit. The allotted student, after submitting all the requirements, has to occupy the hostel room within 5 days with the approval of the warden of the hostel to which he/she is allotted. Joining of the hostel mess is compulsory for all the residents. Ragging, physical violence, and consumption of alcoholic or narcotics substances are strictly prohibited in the hostels.

1. Students' Grievance Redressal Committee:

The Students' Grievance Redressal Committee is incorporated in *The Mizoram University Ordinance*.

Powers and functions of the Committee are as follows:-

- a) to entertain written and signed complaints and petitions of students in respect of matters directly affecting them individually or as a group;
- b) to enquire into the grievances, and make recommendations and report to the concerned authorities for redressal or suitable action; and
- c) to recommend appropriate action against complainant, if allegations made in the documents are found to be baseless.

The Central Library building surrounded by trees is disabled-friendly, barrier free with ramps. It has a power back-up of 100 KW standalone Solar PV Power Plant to ensure uninterrupted power supply. The Central Library earned the appreciation of NAAC Peer Team in 2013 as 'having good facilities, good maintenance and a beautiful library' as well as 'one of the best libraries not only in the North-East, but Eastern India'. It also earned the reputation of being **one of the institutional strength**, with state of the art facilities and a fully automated library by the NAAC Peer team in 2019.



Students can expect to find good reading materials which have been made available in machine readable catalogue since the year 2008, as well as *e-Books*. These are supplemented by e-resources received from INFLIBNET. Library Orientation Programmes for newly admitted students are conducted, where they are introduced and taught how to access the various types of facilities/resources. 2. Health Center

The Health Center at Mizoram University consists of three (3) regular Doctors, 3 Nurses, 2 Pharmacists, 1 Dresser, 1 Laboratory Technician, 1 Office Staff and 1 Multi-Tasking Staff. The Center provides basic facility for curative and preventive measures and plays an important part in educating and maintaining the health status of the students, staff and the faculty. It also has a well-equipped Laboratory, performing various basic investigations. Resident medical doctor and resident staff nurse are on emergency duty at night.



The different medical care provided at the Health Center are:

1. Consultation and treatment of patients coming to the OPD.
2. Pharmacy with dispensary.
3. Laboratory for Serological/Hematological/ Bio-Chemistry/ Urine tests.
4. Emergency/ Casualty room.
5. Dressing room
6. Dental chamber where regular visits are made by two dental surgeons (Private practitioners).
7. Ambulance service for emergency purpose.

3. The ICT Centre currently has 50 Computers with internet facilities for Students and Faculty. The centre also conducts training programmes for students and staff. Efforts are on to have a full e-governance system at the university.

The main objective of the Natural History Museum is to provide a storehouse of collection of the biodiversity of the region, to provide or act as resources and reference for research, to provide resources to institutions for education purposes and to co-ordinate natural history projects with other institutions and organizations, both nationally and internationally. Dr. John Zothanzama, Department of Biotechnology, Mizoram University is the Coordinator of the Natural History Museum.

1. **Human Resource Development Centre:**

The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, Mizoram University previously known as Academic Staff College was established in March, 2009 with financial assistance from the University Grant Commission to upgrade the knowledge and skills of faculty members of the institutions of higher education. 5. **Faculty Development Centre (FDC):**

Faculty Development Centre (FDC), Mizoram University under Department of Education was established on October, 2018 under Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMNMTT) Scheme of MHRD, Government of India, New Delhi. The FDC provides resources and services to support the mission, vision and values for the capacity building of the teachers from primary to higher education level. It has a vision to promote institutional effectiveness through personal, organizational and professional growth of teachers. Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) is a major and unique initiative of online professional development of higher education faculty using Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) of SWAYAM platform. All in-service teachers, irrespective of their subject and seniority will register and complete these refresher courses which will help them in their career.

7. **Bio-Tech Hub and the Bio-Informatics Centre** for teaching and research has been set up at the Department of Bio-Technology. The Department received 2nd Best Bioinformatics Infrastructural Facility (BIF) among all centers of BIF of Indian Universities by Department of Technology, Government of India.

8. **Mizoram University BioNEST**

Mizoram University Bioincubator Nurturing Entrepreneurship for Scaling Technologies (BioNEST) is a biotechnology incubator which started functioning in 2019 under the aegis of Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), Department of Biotechnology to provide infrastructure, managerial and scientific support to researchers, investors and entrepreneurs looking to transform innovations in life sciences, medical technology and environmental sciences into viable and successful enterprises.

9. **Biodiversity Research Centre**

The Biodiversity Research Centre (BRC) functions under the Department of Environmental Science, School of Earth Science & Natural Resource Management, Mizoram University. Sanctioned by the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, the Centre caters to Research & Development activities linked with ecology, evolution, and conservation of biological diversity at all levels from gene to ecosystem through interactions with human society. It envisages the creation of a hub for collection, collation, management, analysis and dissemination of data on biological diversity.

10. **DRDO-NEST Centre**

North East Science & Technology Centre (NESTC) is established at Mizoram University, Aizawl with full support of Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO), New Delhi. The centre is aimed to pursue Directed Basic and Applied Research in Technology thrust areas with multi-institutional collaboration to meet critical and futuristic defence technological requirements. NESTC will collaborate with the academic researchers & faculties, incubation centre at MZU and other institutions in the country, industries and DRDO laboratories and other scientific/industrial research laboratories for creating new knowledge and translating them into cutting-edge technologies for defence.

11. **Mizoram University Innovation Cell (MZU InnoCell)**

The Mizoram University Innovation Cell has been set up with the aim of identifying, encouraging and fostering innovative and entrepreneurial talent within the MZU fold as well as its environmental sectors and areas. The Innovation Cell aims to put in concerted efforts to identify grass-root innovators from formal and informal sectors in varied domains and to establish Innovation Clubs across the various departments within the university to foster and facilitate the students.

12. Mizoram University - Yunus Social Business Centre

The vision of MZU-YSBC is to create a 'Poverty-Free Mizoram and Beyond' and make it a better place to live by applying the social business concept. 13. Technology Enabling Center (DST Funded)

Mizoram University established Technology Enabling Centre funded by DST in the Year 2019. Mizoram University TEC is a satellite center under the mentorship of Tezpur University, Assam. The goal of DST-TEC is to foster an ecosystem for training and technology transfer, and to concentrate on the mining of technologies present in host and partner Institutions. TEC will strive to create an Ecosystem for Technology Development in the Universities and provide a platform to network researchers with other institutes, National laboratories and industry. 16. Centre For Petroleum Geosciences

The Centre for Petroleum Geosciences under the Department of Geology, Mizoram University started functioning on November, 2019. The Course is offered by joint efforts of the Centre for Petroleum Geosciences, the Department of Industrial Chemistry, and the Department of Geology, Mizoram University and offers the following Programme:

M.Sc. in Petroleum Geosciences & Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D)

Human resource development in India may be achieved through academic excellence which enables all learners to reach their potential. Strategies for developing human resources should be based on broad and long-term perspectives of the regional needs and resources through capacity building.

Centre for Petroleum Geosciences offers M. Sc. Degree in Petroleum Geosciences which includes a wide range of innovative solutions particularly in the hydrocarbon exploration field for sustainable development of resources in India and worldwide. This program will be executed in collaboration with the **Department of Industrial Chemistry and the Department of Geology, Mizoram University.**

The designed course is to be considered for different sections of oil and gas explorations with a particular setup of geoscience and chemistry background. The course is expected to generate human resources equipped with basic scientific and technical understanding of the geological background of the petroleum exploration methods, production, behavior, and handling of hydrocarbon fuels and lubricants. The course is intended to enable students to contribute effectively in the technically demanding appointments in the field of oil & gas/petrochemical Industry. Petroleum geology is the study of origin, occurrence, movement, accumulation, and exploration of hydrocarbon fuels. It refers to the specific set of geological disciplines that are applied to the search for hydrocarbons (oil exploration).

Eligibility:

Candidates with a degree in Geology as major subject (Hons.), other subjects at B Sc. level may be Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology or any other combination. For Ph.D Programme, Post-Graduate in the relevant subject.



BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B.VOC.) PROGRAMMES & CERTIFICATE COURSES

 - (a) A candidate who has passed B.Tech/M.Sc./B.E Or Equivalent Examination in relevant branch from any recognized institute or university having a minimum 55% marks (relaxable by 5% for SC/ST candidates) in aggregate shall be eligible for admission.
 - (b) A candidate must have a valid GATE score or must qualify Mizoram University Master of Technology Entrance Examination (MZU-MTEE).
 - (c) Foreign students shall be admitted as per rules of MHRD/UGC/MZU/AICTE.
 - (d) The selection of the candidates will be based on the GATE score or Mizoram University Master of Technology Entrance Examination (MZU-MTEE) followed by personal interview. Each department shall have separate admission committee.
 - (e) The list relevant branch in B.Tech/M.Sc. or equivalent examination shall be decided by Department BOS subject to the approval of Academic council.

(Honours/General) in Psychology or B.A./B.Sc. in allied subjects such as Social Work, Sociology, Education, Nursing, Medical, Management, Political Science or B.A./B.Sc. in cognate subjects such as Public Administration and Mass Communication with minimum score of 50% marks in aggregate at undergraduate level.
- ii) **Ph.D. Nursing:** Candidates having M.Phil (Nursing)/ M.Sc (Nursing)/ PG Degree in nursing recognized by Indian Nursing Council with 3 years Teaching or Clinical Experience after M.Sc (Nursing). Candidates should have passed M.Sc Nursing with a minimum of 60% marks. Candidates working in Teaching Institution/Hospital/Community Centre may also apply.
- iii) **Ph.D. Pharmacy:** Candidates with M.Pharm Degree/ PG Degree in related subject from a recognized university.

11. School of Education

i) Education:

- i) M.A. (Education) (refer to Sl.12). A candidate with 50% marks in B.Ed. may also apply for admission to M.A. education course.
- ii) B.Ed. – candidates with at least 50% marks either in Bachelor's degree and/or in Master's degree in Sciences/ Social Sciences/ Humanities, Bachelor Degree in Engineering or technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.
- iii) M.Ed. – candidates with at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade in B.Ed./B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed./ B.El.Ed. are eligible for admission. Candidates with D.El.Ed. with 50% marks in Bachelor's Degree are also eligible to apply for admission.

12. For other disciplines, candidates who have passed a Three Year Degree Course in the relevant subject shall ordinarily be considered for admission to the Master Degree Course.

13. For Admission to the Ph.D Programme under various departments, Mizoram University follows the Eligibility Criteria as specified under UGC Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree Regulations, 2022.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Availability/Reservation of seats:

- i) Upto 10% of seats may be assigned to students from other disciplines. It is also provided that if teaching of Honours in a subject has not been 'sufficiently developed within the jurisdiction of the University or in any unit in particular,' seats in the concerned Department may be filled in a manner as may be decided by the respective Department in accordance with University Regulation RC-I.
- ii) The distribution of total seats available shall be as follows:

Open Category	- 50%	Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs)	- 10% (in addition to the existing seats)
SC/ST candidates	- 50%		
- iii) Five percent of the above seats shall be reserved for Persons with Disabilities. Such applications shall be supported by a Disability Certificate issued by a Competent Authority in a prescribed format. An applicant with 40% to 60% disability may be given 5% added weightage and above 60%, 7% added weightage.
- iv) Reservations are also available as and when MHRD/UGC prescribes Special Categories issued from time to time.
- v) For all programmes, Reservation as per University norms plus sponsored seats are available (refer to Intake Capacity).
- vi) Ten percent of the above seats are earmarked as University special quota for the following categories:
 - (a) Unrepresented Backward Areas: The level of backwardness may be determined vis-a-vis the national level of literacy. An applicant coming from an area having up to 5% below the national level of literacy may be given 5% added weightage to the marks obtained by the applicant at the qualifying exams.
 - (b) Outstanding Sportsmen/Sportswomen: 10% weightage for representing the country at International Level, 5% for representing the State at National Level and 3% for Inter-University at National Level added weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams.
 - (c) Children of Regular Employees of Mizoram University: 7% weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams. Certificate of employment may be issued by the Office of the Registrar.

NOTE: Applicants are required to submit necessary documents in support of their claims.

Eligibility Test:

For Admission into various courses offered by the University, the score of Candidates in either CUET or MZU Entrance Test will be considered. 50% of the marks obtained in the qualifying examination added with the marks obtained in the Entrance Tests will be considered for determining Merit for admission. For admission into Ph.D , The admission Committee of the respective Departments will frame the necessary admission process.

In case of internal students i.e. students who have graduated from Colleges affiliated to or maintained by this University, 15 marks will be added to the marks obtained in the concerned subject. In case of those candidates who have not offered the subject in the Major/Honours no such weightage shall be given and their marks in the Major/Honours subject without weightage shall be taken into account.

Admission Committee:

Departments shall constitute respective Admission Committees and assign members specific responsibilities. Students, who have already obtained a Master's Degree from this University or any other University will be considered for admission only if there is any vacancy after considering all eligible candidates seeking admission. In respect of such candidates the general criteria of marks obtained at Honours level will be considered.

Incase a student is repeating the entire semester due to shortage of attendance or any other reason, he/she has to pay 25% of the semester fees (excluding examination fee). Incase a student is repeating the first semester, the corpus fee may also be excluded.



ADMISSION GUIDELINES & COURSE FEES FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign Students admitted to different programmes of study at Mizoram University shall pay fee in the following manner at the beginning of each semester either in US Dollars or equivalent in Indian Rupees as per the prevailing exchange rates. The procedure for the admission of International students to various courses are based on General Guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and Statutory / Regulatory directives issued from time to time.

- a) The university agrees in principle to admit International students to the Post-Graduate, Undergraduate and Ph.D. programmes to provide educational opportunities to International students in different fields in three ways:
 - i) on full time basis,
 - ii) on Indian Government and foreign government scholarship/fellowship programmes such as the Cultural Exchange Fellowship Program of ICCR, USIEF - Fulbright, Humboldt Fellowships, ICSSR and UGC schemes etc.
 - iii) As semester students to audit/credit the course or courses
- b) The International Students Centre and Collaborations office is the single window for all the foreign nationals who wish to seek admission in Mizoram University in different programmes. It also serves as the window for collaborations between Mizoram University and Universities in and outside India.
- c) International Student means (i) a student candidate who holds a Passport/ Citizenship of a country other than India, (ii) a student candidate who has an OCI/ PIO Card and also holds a Passport of a country other than India.
- d) International students will be considered for admission over and above the existing seat allotment in each department and under each faculty member.

FULL TIME FOREIGN SCHOLAR

1. Eligibility& Qualification:

International Students seeking admission in any programme will have to satisfy the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to the various programmes of study as prescribed by the University. The qualifications required for eligibility for admission to different programmes can be checked in detail from the prospectus or university website. The minimum educational qualification for admission of International students in various programmes is same as for Indian students.

- i) Candidates seeking admission to any program must have studied the allied subjects of the concerned program at the Undergraduate(XII), Graduate (Degree) or Post Graduate(Masters) level prior to seeking admission.
- ii) For the Graduate course(Degree), only those students who have studied and passed the qualifying examination from a school located in a foreign country shall be considered. This will include the students studying in schools and / or colleges located in a foreign country, even if the concerned school / college is affiliated to any Board of Secondary Higher Secondary education or a University in India. However, wards of NRI / PIO / FN, who are studying for the qualifying examination in schools / colleges located in India, are excluded.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES & COURSE FEES FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

- iii) In case of any school that follows the American system of education, the candidate must have studied the allied subjects at “AP” (Advanced Placement) level and must have minimum C grade in these subjects.
- iv) The candidate shall get equivalence certificate from the Association of Indian University (AIU), New Delhi. Only those students who have qualified from Foreign Universities or Boards of Higher Education, recognized as equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are eligible for admission. When required, a reference will be made to AIU to check the equivalent.

Equivalence Certificate : For issue of Equivalence Certificate, the required fee in US \$ or equivalent Indian currency payable through Demand Draft favouring "Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi" is required. For prescribed application form to be submitted to the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi refer detailed guidelines of Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi for international admission available on <http://www.aiuweb.org/Evaluation/evaluation.asp>.

ADMISSION

2.1 Admission information:

Students willing to join the university for various programmes will get the information about the application form and the information on the eligibility requirements, courses available and admission procedure from the prospectus or the website of the university.

2.2 Provisional admission form:

The application for provisional admission is to be submitted to the ISCC office along with the prescribed fees on or before the last date specified. The office will then check the eligibility and issue the provisional eligibility letter. This is required to get the visa and to complete other formalities.

2.3 Provisional Admission procedure:

- i) Application for provisional eligibility in the prescribed form can be downloaded from the university website. A prescribed eligibility fee (USD 30-50) has to be deposited along with the form before the last date specified.
- ii) Attach with this application form photocopies of the statement of marks of the last qualifying examinations duly attested by:
 - a. Indian Embassy in International country, or
 - b. High Commissioner of students' home country in India, or
 - c. Ministry of Education in International country.
 - d. In case of Ph.D. course enclose a copy of the outline of the proposed research along with the application form.
- iii) Attach Migration Certificate in original with the application form. This is obligatory for those coming from any other Statutory Indian University.
- iv) Attach affidavit to the application form relating to the gap between year of passing and the last qualifying examination and the date of application for admission to Mizoram University (not required for Ph.D. programmes).
- v) The ISCC office will issue the provisional eligibility letter after scrutinizing the forms and on the basis of credentials verified by the University and the Association of Indian University. Only those applicants who fulfill the eligibility requirements and are recommended for admission are issued a provisional admission letter by the ISCC office pending approval of the concerned department. The provisional admission letter is sent to the applicant's Embassy in New Delhi, Indian High Commission in applicant's home country and a scanned copy of the letter to the applicant's email address.

2.4 Final admission:

After obtaining the provisional eligibility letter the following requirements have to be fulfilled:

i) Visa:

All the International students will require a student visa endorsed solely to Mizoram University for joining the Undergraduate Programme, Post-Graduate Programme, Certificate or Diploma Programme, and M. Phil. Programme. No other endorsement is acceptable. Students wishing to join a PhD programme will require a Research Visa endorsed to Mizoram University. All visas should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course.

ii) No objection certificate:

International students do not require to submit a No Objection Certificate for joining professional courses. However, all International students willing to undertake any research work or join a Ph. D. or M. Phil. programmes will have to obtain prior security clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and the approval of Department of Secondary & Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and must be on the research visa endorsed to Mizoram University.

iv) Medical& Fitness test:

The students may undertake the following tests in their country failing which they will have to undergo these tests in India.

- i) HIV test.
- ii) Hepatitis surface Antigen (HBsAg)/ Australia Antigen before admission.
- iii) Any other test as specified by the State and Central Government at the time.

v) English proficiency test:

An International student shall be required to produce a valid certificate of test for English language or be exempted from this provided –

- i) The student has passed the qualifying examination in English medium, or
- ii) The student has a valid score in Proficiency Test in English like TOEFL and ELTIS.

EXAMINATION AND AWARD OF DEGREES & DIPLOMAS

The procedure for examination, payment of examination fees, issue of mark sheet, issue of passing certificates and award of degrees will be same as for the Indian students undergoing the same courses.

FELLOWS/SCHOLARS THROUGH INDIAN AND FOREIGN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMMES

Foreign students may also be admitted for studies under Indian Government and foreign government scholarship/fellowship programmes such as the Cultural Exchange Fellowship Program of ICCR, USIEF, and Humboldt Fellowships etc. The foreign students seeking admission under the programmes are required to process their applications through the institutions and agencies in charge of the programs in India and abroad. In the event of their selection and approval of affiliating faculty, the students and the organizing institutions will be informed about their selection.

SEMESTER STUDENTS TO AUDIT/CREDIT COURSE(S)

Foreign students studying a regular course in their respective universities in their own country may join the University for a semester or two to audit/credit the course(s) in any of the Centre/Schools of Study. If admission is given for auditing, Certificate of Participation will be issued by the faculty In-Charge of the course and if admission is given for credit, End-Semester Grade Sheet will be issued by the University, subject to the condition that they attend the semester classes and appear in the End Semester Examination.

INTAKE CAPACITY

1. *The intake capacity for Under-Graduate, Post-Graduate, Ph.D will be as per availability of seats in the respective academic department, which will be notified in the university website (www.mzu.edu.in).*
2. *For Engineering Programmes, 50% seats are for Mizoram University Engineering Entrance Examination (MZUEEE) and the other 50% from JEE (CSAB).*
3. *For Post-Graduate programmes, 10% of seats are reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) over and above the existing seats. Professional courses such as Engineering, Architecture, Education (Professional) will go for reservation for EWSs within the framework of sanctioned seats.*
4. *For M.Tech (Computer Science & Engineering) programme under combined department (i.e. Department of Computer Engineering & Department of Information Technology), will be coordinated by Department of Information Technology vide AC:33:4(28)(4)(1).*
5. *For Planning & Architecture programme, 50% seats are for MZU online entrance exam with valid NATA score and the other 50% from Joint Seat Allocation Authority (JoSAA)/(CSAB).*
6. *20% or 10% sponsored seats adjusted from existing intake capacity vide EC:46:5(20) and EC:48:6(1).*

SWAYAM

The Online Education



SWAYAM is a programme initiated by Government of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz., access, equity and quality. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. SWAYAM seeks to bridge the digital divide for students who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital revolution and have not been able to join the mainstream of the knowledge economy.

This is done through a platform that facilitates hosting of all the courses, taught in classrooms from Class 9 till post-graduation to be accessed by anyone, anywhere at any time. All the courses are interactive, prepared by the best teachers in the country and are available, free of cost to any learner. More than 1,000 specially chosen faculty and teachers from across the country have participated in preparing these courses.

The courses hosted on SWAYAM are in 4 quadrants – (1) video lecture, (2) specially prepared reading material that can be downloaded/printed (3) self-assessment tests through tests and quizzes and (4) an online discussion forum for clearing the doubts. Steps have been taken to enrich the learning experience by using audio-video and multi-media and state of the art pedagogy / technology.

In order to ensure that best quality content is produced and delivered, nine National Coordinators have been appointed. They are:

1. AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education) for self-paced and international courses
2. NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning) for Engineering
3. UGC (University Grants Commission) for non technical post-graduation education
4. CEC (Consortium for Educational Communication) for under-graduate education
5. NCERT (National Council of Educational Research and Training) for school education
6. NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling) for school education
7. IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University) for out-of-school students
8. IIMB (Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore) for management studies
9. NITTTR (National Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research) for Teacher Training programme

Courses delivered through SWAYAM are available free of cost to the learners, however learners wanting a SWAYAM certificate should register for the final proctored exams that come at a fee and attend in-person at designated centres on specified dates. Eligibility for the certificate will be announced on the course page and learners will get certificates only if this criteria is matched. Universities/colleges approving credit transfer for these courses can use the marks/certificate obtained in these courses for the same.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Social Sciences

The School of Social Sciences came into being as an entity in 2002. The School consists of the Departments of Psychology, Public Administration, Political Science, Social Work, History & Ethnography and Sociology. All the academic departments offer Post-Graduate programmes and Ph. D. programmes in accordance with the rules of the University and availability of academic facilities.

The students in different departments of the school are exposed to quality teaching and research endeavours with the active participation of qualified and experienced faculty. They are also given practical training, field exposure and similar academic and extension programmes, wherever necessary, along with facilities for participation in international and national seminars and workshops, documentation and publication activities.

The School publishes a bi-annual Refereed Journal Contemporary Social Scientist with ISSN number which caters to the academic and the research requirements of various social science disciplines, humanities and liberal arts. The School of Social Sciences arranges International and National seminars and interactive sessions with visiting dignitaries and experts in different fields of Social Sciences.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Humanities & Languages

The school was established under its present name as per approval of the Ministry of Education, Government of India and the subsequent publication of the change in nomenclature in the Gazette of India on 11th July, 2022. It was earlier a part of the erstwhile School of Education and Humanities. The school has several disciplines under its umbrella and these are the departments of English and Culture Studies, Mizo and Hindi as well as Philosophy in Pachhunga University College (PUC) which is a constituent college. In the absence of a PG department of Philosophy in the university, the school takes care of UG matters pertaining to the department. All the departments with the exception of Philosophy (which offers only MA) offer MA and Ph.D. courses in their respective disciplines. The Department of English and Culture Studies has focused upon pivotal aspects that are related to paradigms within literature and culture and translation studies. It has been awarded the UGC SAP DRS from 2011-2016 and 2017-2020 running into two phases namely DRS I and DRS II. The Department of Mizo has focused upon the growth and the development of the Mizo language and literature and has a quarterly journal pertaining to the same. The Hindi Department has focused upon popularising the Hindi language across the university and the state.

All the departments have well qualified and experienced faculty. The departments have a well inculcated vision that focus upon the introduction of certificate and diploma courses and are equipped with smart classrooms. They have organised seminars and conferences and faculty have been awarded major and minor research projects and have been the recipients of several national and state level awards.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Education

The School of Education, Mizoram University became functional with the appointment of the Dean on 12th August, 2022. Its history of establishment started from the XII Five Year Plan. In response to the UGC's invitation for supplementary proposal under the XII plan for establishment of Department of Education for strengthening of teacher education; Mizoram University submitted a proposal to start B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes in the Department. The programmes as well as the faculty positions were sanctioned by the UGC in 2013. Recognition of the said courses was obtained from NCTE in 2016.

In line with the provision of School of Education under the Scheme of PMMMNMTT, up-gradation of the existing Department of Education to School of Education was approved in principle by the 32nd meeting of Academic Council in 2017. With the approval of the MoE, the previous School of Education and Humanities was bifurcated and the School of Education came into existence in August, 2022.

Currently, there are 4 academic programmes under School of Education - (i) M.A. Education started in 1979 with an intake of 40 (ii) B.Ed. started in 2016 with an intake of 100 for 2 units/sections (iii) M.Ed. started in 2018 with an intake of 50 and, (iv) Ph.D. started in 1979.

There are more than 400 students in Education Department/ School of Education. Teaching and Research in School of Education is supported by 28 dedicated faculty members (5 Professors, 2 Associate Professors and 21 Assistant Professors) and 8 non-teaching staff (2 from Dean's office and 5 from Education Department).

The School has a plan to start Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) and B.P.Ed. in the near future. Statutory bodies of the University have approved both the courses and UGC's sanctions of faculty positions are being awaited.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Economics, Management & Information Science

The six departments operating under the School are Economics, Commerce, Library and Information Science, Tourism & Hospitality Management, Management and Mass Communication. Students of different disciplines are exposed to latest knowledge and skills which help them in pursuing higher studies and research and getting employment in relevant fields. The School has initiated a number of relevant courses in the areas of Economics, Commerce, Library and Information Science, Tourism & Hospitality Management, Management and Mass Communication keeping in view the global trends and developments in the 21st Century.

It is a regular feature for the departments to organize workshops, seminars, refresher courses and field based practicals. Many students who have passed out from this school have been employed by reputed organizations, including private and public sector banks and the office of the Comptroller of Auditor and Accountant General, Govt. of India.

The Department of Management offers Programmes in Business Administration (MBA). The Department of Tourism & Hospitality Management offers MBA in Tourism & Hospitality Management. The courses are designed to offer students the experience of working in real world situations under the guidance of mentors. The Department of Commerce offers B.Voc programme for Handloom weavers under National Skill Qualification Framework.

The School also offers Ph.D. programmes in Economics, Commerce, Library & Information Science, Management, Mass Communication, and Tourism & Hospitality Management.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Physical Sciences

The School of Physical Sciences has 4 departments: Physics, Chemistry, Industrial Chemistry, and Mathematics & Computer Science. All the 4 departments under the School have excellent Laboratory facilities & departmental library developed with financial support from D.S.T., Govt. of India under DST-FIST Programme. The School has dedicated faculty & staff to support the students. Almost all the faculty members have research projects and research scholars working under their supervision. The School also renders its support in the teaching of B.Tech. courses.

The Physics department offers 3 specializations namely Condensed Matter Physics, Electronics and Laser & Spectroscopy for PG students. Chemistry department offers 4 specializations namely Physical, Inorganic, Organic & Analytical Chemistry at PG level. Mathematics & Computer Science department offers 2 special papers namely; Optimization Techniques and Numerical Solution to Differential Equations to PG students. Industrial Chemistry department offers M.Sc. (Industrial Chemistry) and curriculum mostly focussed to industries related subjects which include petroleum refining and petrochemicals, agrochemicals, polymers, pharmaceuticals, fertilizers, paints etc. Students can opt for any subject of their choice and can expect full support of Faculty and staff in pursuing their goals. The school is looking forward to admit sincere, hardworking and disciplined students.

Physics department is equipped with excellent laboratory facilities with 6-PG and 5-Research Labs. Faculty members often organize National & International Seminars/Conference/Workshop/Inv. Lectures etc., from time to time. Chemistry department is well equipped with excellent Laboratory facilities having 4 PG laboratories and 5 Research laboratories including one Spectroscopy lab. Mathematics & Computer Science department is also equipped with excellent Computational Laboratory facilities and a departmental library facility funded by NBHM. Industrial Chemistry department is currently equipped with one PG laboratory and one research laboratory.



The School offers good ambience for study and research work. Having good support structure in place, the students seeking admission to PG or Research are cordially invited to take admission in the departments & Research Projects under this School. The School is looking forward to introduce M.Sc. (Electronics) in the Department of Physics and MCA in the Department of Mathematics & Computer Science, in the near future.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Life Sciences

The School of Life Sciences was established in the year 2005 and consists of the departments of Zoology, Botany and Biotechnology. All the Departments offer M.Sc. and Ph.D. degree courses.

The different departments of the school have well qualified faculty members actively involved in teaching & research. The school has developed a modern animal house, tissue culture laboratory, museum, transgenic glass and net houses. The School is engaged in the frontier areas of research in biological sciences including Cancer biology, Conservation biology, Molecular Entomology, algal physiology, oxidative stress, microbial diversity, forest ecology, ethno botany, plant and microbial biotechnology which are supported by ICMR, CSIR, DBT (twinning), UGC, DST, ICAR, Central Silk Board and Mizoram Govt. Health department. The School is equipped with state of the art equipment, Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF) and Advanced-State Biotech Hub for teaching and research. The department has been able to develop with the best infrastructure for its teaching and research programme. The Department of Zoology has an Animal House Facility which is registered with the National Authority (Registration No. 1999/GO/REBI/S/18/CPCSEA) by an authorised body.

Institutional Animal Ethics Committee and Biosafety Committee are also active for smooth implementation of specific research programme. To strengthen collaborative research, inter-institution MOU with international (Bangor University, UK) and national institution (NIPER), and with education institute (Alagappa University) has been signed.

The Department of Zoology was awarded a DST-FIST programme for further strengthening its infrastructure and received a mega research project funded/sanctioned by G.B. Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment and Sustainable Development (GBPNIHESD), Almora.

The School provides training and gives regional importance to research development in its programme. Several International / National / State Level Seminars /Conferences have been organised.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Earth Sciences & Natural Resources Management

The School was established in 2002 as “School of Forestry & Earth Sciences”. Later, it was renamed as “School of Earth Sciences & Natural Resources Management”, in 2006. The School comprises of 5 (five) functioning Academic Departments: Forestry, Geology, Environmental Science, Geography & Resource Management and Horticulture, Aromatic & Medicinal Plants (HAMP). All Academic Departments offer Post Graduate Studies and Ph.D Programmes, and a Pre-Ph.D Course (equivalent to M.Phil Programme).

Taking up the challenge and catering the need to fill up the gap of manpower requirement in the endeavor of sustainable rural development and to accelerate the pace of national as well as global economic development, Mizoram University established the Department of 'Extension Education and Rural Development' under this school on February, 2007. The department has been working on various number of research projects, since its inception and offers Ph.D programmes. Two new centres have been recently established under this school- Centre of Disaster Management and Centre for Petroleum Exploration offering M.Sc. and Ph.D Programmes.

The two year PG course and Ph.D. programmes, under these departments are demanding as students intake capacity has been increased considerably, allowing students unsurpassed contact to learn and interact with researchers and academicians in the school. The thrust areas of research of the School include exploration and management of human and crop resources, medicinal and aromatic plants, land and water resources, rocks and minerals, bio-resources, R&D activities and aims to address the following areas:

- To explore and develop sustainable utilization of water/land, natural / biological resources of NE Region and Mizoram, in particular.
- To address global and regional environmental problems and tackle the problems related to landslide, earthquakes, and potable water pollution at the local level.
- To equip with International and National Policies, Acts, Rules, Laws & Guidelines on Environmental Pollution, Biodiversity, Energy, Growth of Medicinal Plants and Environmental Impact Assessment notified by the Government from time to time.
- To offer extension services towards sustainable rural development
- To produce competent professionals and specialists of younger generations in the field of Land Use Planning, RS & GIS, Agro-forestry, Fossil fuels and minerals and Management of Environment, Biodiversity, Natural Resources etc., and to encounter natural disaster viz. earthquake and landslides in particular.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Engineering & Technology

The school of Engineering and Technology (SET) is currently offering B.Tech programmes in six different branches of Engineering. The school was established in the year 2007 with the Department of Information Technology, the Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering in 2008, and in 2012, the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Engineering. The Department of Civil Engineering was started in 2015 and admissions in M.Sc Food Technology under the school started from 2019 Academic Session. The school now offers M.Tech programmes and Ph.D programmes in various department.

The school has young and dedicated faculty. ICT is used for facilitating teaching learning process. Experiments and hand –on training are provided as per requirement of the programme. Industrial training is a must. The academic syllabi are updated frequently to meet the requirements of the present technology and job market demands.

Seminar/conference/workshops are frequently conducted for the students and faculty in collaborations with other organisations/agencies. The school has a proactive Techno club which organises various types of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Placement services with corporate houses, government organisation and industries are conducted separately or jointly with other institutes. Various reputed organisations like Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd., Wipro, Capgemini, Infosys, Airtel etc. have conducted campus placement. Many of our alumni are pursuing higher studies abroad, IITs, NITs etc. Many are working in various reputed government organisation/industry/ company/organisation.



The School of Engineering and Technology is equipped with all the necessary facilities and proper ambience for imparting quality education in Engineering and Technology at par with other institutions.

SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

School of Fine Arts, Architecture & Fashion Technology

The School was set up in the year 2011 with the opening of Department of Planning & Architecture. The other two Departments in this School viz., Department of Fine Arts and Department of Fashion Technology are yet to be established.

B.Arch. programme in the Department of Planning & Architecture has been successfully started since the academic session 2015-16. The Department had obtained its official recognition from the Council of Architecture (COA), New Delhi in the month of June, 2015. The admission in B.Arch. programme is based on the existing regulation of taking 50% of the available seats through JEE main whereas remaining 50% are to be filled through the Mizoram University Aptitude Test in Architecture (MZU-ATA) essentially having valid NATA score card. The Department has started B.Voc programme in Interior Design (3 year programme with multiple exit) and Ph.D. programme in Architecture from the academic session 2020-2021. The Department is planning to open Master Degree (M.Arch.) in future.

School of Medical and Paramedical Sciences

The School of Medical and Para Medical Sciences was established in the year 2008 to meet the high demands of medical and para medical services in the country especially for the local people of Mizoram. It has one Academic Department in the University Campus which is -Department of Clinical Psychology and many other courses in affiliated colleges.

Department of Clinical Psychology: It started functioning from 1st August, 2019, offering PG and Ph. D programme. The department is taking steps to open M.Phil in Clinical Psychology (that carry practicing license in disabilities) after getting RCI recognition which is under process. The department is functioning with 5 regular academic faculties, with a vision to establish Centre for Behavioral Intervention and Research Centre, here in Mizoram University Campus .

ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS

Department of Social Work

The Department of Social Work was initiated under NEHU (Mizoram Campus) in July, 1990 by Dr. Bharti Sharma, Reader and Founder-Head of the Department. It was however, only on the formation of the full-fledged Mizoram University that the Masters Programme in Social Work was started. The MSW course commenced on 1st August, 2002. The department imparts education and training in professional Social Work with the aim of providing qualified personnel in Social Welfare and Social development with specific reference to North-East Region. At present, the department is offering MSW, and Ph.D. degree programmes. The MSW programme offers two specialisations namely, Community Development, Family and Child Welfare. Department of Zoology

The Department of Zoology as a post-graduate department came into existence on 11th February 2005 and the first batch of M.Sc. students were admitted in the academic session beginning 2006. The syllabus of M.Sc. course is framed based on UGC CBCS guidelines. The Department offers P.G. and Ph.D courses. The syllabus of M.Sc course is strictly framed on the NEP-2020 syllabus based on the UGC guidelines, and will comprise of four semesters of six months duration each. The Research Areas include Metagenomics, Toxicogenomics, Molecular Phylogeny, Developmental Biology and Herpatology, Toxicology, Mammalian Reproductive Physiology, Cancer and Radiation Biology, Chronobiology, Cytogenetics, and Infection Biology. The whole course has been allocated 80 credits and will consist of 28 credits for Disciplinary Major subjects, 6 credits for Inter-disciplinary Major subjects, 6 credits for Disciplinary Minor subjects, 6 credits for Inter-disciplinary Minor subjects, 16 credits for Field projects/Internship/Apprenticeship and 18 credits for dissertation. There will be two dissertations based on specialized courses of 6 and 12 credits during the third and fourth semester. The Department has sanctioned special grant under DST-FIST programme. It also maintains a modern animal house, tissue culture facilities, and a museum. The Department has procured state of art equipments under the DST- FIST to cater to the needs of teaching and research at an advanced level.

The Department was established and started functioning from July 2002 with the name FEBES (Forest Ecology, Biodiversity & Environmental Science), and later on renamed as Department of Environmental Science in 2008. The academics of the Department focus on the teaching and research activities on various aspects pertaining to Environmental Science. In addition, the 'Biodiversity Research Centre', of the Department of Environmental Science strengthens R&D programme on exploration of bio-resources at a large. The 'Biodiversity Research Centre' aims at carrying out extensive researches on the aspects- biodiversity inventory and conservation on sustained basis, exploration of ethno-medicinal wealth, natural regeneration, eco-restoration of degraded ecosystem and environmental awareness. The Department has maintained the 'Botanical Garden' with 'Biodiversity Park' within the university campus to facilitate researches on biodiversity conservation under controlled field condition. The Herbarium established in the Department has a large depository for plant specimen. 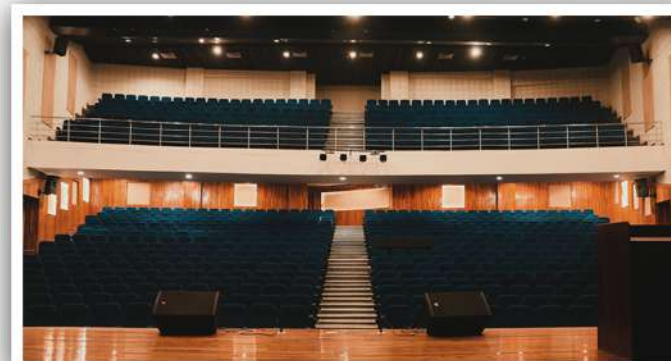
